First organization in India to shoulder the Concept

The Trust visualized a concept of making districts Cataract Backlog Free Zone in collaboration with Help Me See Inc., USA and govt. district authorities in 2012 and formulated in the year 2013 by initiating this concept in District Chitrakoot, Uttar Pradesh (declaration of Cataract Backlog Free Zone will be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct, 2014).

Extending these services, the Trust has now shouldered the responsibility of District Panna, Madhya Pradesh and District Banda in collaboration with Help Me See Inc., USA and govt. district authorities of Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.. The project for the district was inaugurated at Panna District with consent of Collector, District Panna, Mr. R. K. Mishra on 26th May, 2014 and at Banda District in consent with Commissioner Banda, Mr. Murlidhar Dubey on 23rd July, 2014. Senior Paramedical Team of the Trust gave training to 1381 Anganwadi and Asha workers at Panna and 942 Anganwadi and ASHA workers at Banda for door to door screening of visually disabled persons in rural and urban part of District Panna and District Banda.
